CELEBRATING 100 YEARS OF CPAS HOLIDAYS

We mark the incredible milestone of a century's worth of CPAS Christian holidays for children and young people. Thanks to your generous donations and faithful prayers, each year thousands of children and young people from across the UK have had their lives impacted by the gospel, making new friends and having lots of fun.

HOW TO FINANCE YOUR CHILDREN'S AND YOUTH MINISTRY

Two thirds of churches have fewer than five children among their congregation. When churches can invest in children's and youth ministry, there have been exciting signs of growth. The challenge though, is the limited funds churches have available to invest. In light of this, our Fundraising team hosted a webinar called How to Finance Your Children's and Youth Ministry that 135 individuals booked on. It was described as:

THE THRIVE COLLECTION LAUNCH

Since the last edition of Connect magazine, CPAS hosted an online live launch for the Thrive Collection. Joined by the author, Pam Macnaughton, we introduced the collection, taking time to expand on each of the four resources and answer questions from

the 134 guests in attendance.





As we counted the final seconds until 12 noon on a cold and wet

5 December in 2023, we could not believe what we had witnessed.

CPAS has been involved in the Big Give Christmas Challenge every year since 2017. This was our seventh year taking part. Each year, we have been amazed by God's provision and the generosity from our supporters. This peaked in 2022 when CPAS finished the national giving challenge as the top Christian charity in the country. Out of thousands of charities across all categories, we came eighth overall, raising an impressive £142,000 (including Gift Aid). As we prepared for our seventh campaign. during a cost-of-living crisis and with a smaller Fundraising and Communications team, we did not know whether we could reach that total again. That, however, did not deter us from giving it our all.

As part of our campaign, CPAS hosted its first fundraising challenge event. A small group of CPAS staff members from each

ministry area, including our CEO Jon Scamman, came together in Snowdonia to create the Highest Nativity Scene in the land. Braving temperatures as low as -8C the team succeeded, and in response a wave of generous donations followed.

And so, on that overcast 5 December afternoon in our Coventry office, CPAS had not only matched, but surpassed, the previous campaign's incredible total. Thanks to your generosity we raised £153,000 (including Gift Aid). From those funds we can continue to finance key areas of ministry, like our Venture and Falcon holidays where a £100 bursary could enable a young person to learn the truth about a God who loves them.

It goes without saying that none of this would have been possible without your prayerful and financial support. On behalf of everyone at CPAS, our deepest thanks to you.

Memories of Pooley Bridge CPAS Holiday

A s a 12-year-old lad living in the 1960s, my first experience of being away from home without parents or siblings, was travelling by train from Derby to Penrith to a CPAS holiday.

'It was the summer of 1961, my friend and I were waved off from Derby Midland station to travel to Pooley Bridge, via Stoke on Trent and Crewe.

'Being very shy, I found it hard to settle into the holiday, but as the days went by things got much better. I have memories of singing round campfires at night, having a quiet time each morning, and dorm (a large tent) prayers each night. We peeled potatoes for what seemed like an army, but would then go on super walks and trips; climbing Helvellyn was the best, even though the clouds descended. Bible teaching, quizzes, hearty singing and testimonies were all part of an experience that had a massive influence on my life.

'I had been a Christian for five years. All my school mates knew I was a Christian, but I can't say that I showed Christ in what I said and did. The CPAS holiday certainly was a catalyst for change.

'Sixty-two years have passed since that first holiday. and I can honestly say that experience changed my life. Christian Summer Residentials became a major part of what my wife and I have been involved in over the vears. We've led and served on them, and encouraged our own children, and many others, to take part. I thank God for the opportunity of going to Pooley Bridge all those years ago, and for the staff who gave so freely of their time to nurture and encourage us.'

¹ HAD BEEN A CHRISTIAN FOR FIVE YEARS. ALL MY SCHOOL MATES KNEW I WAS A CHRISTIAN, BUT I CAN'T SAY THAT I SHOWED CHRIST IN WHAT I SAID AND DID. THE CPAS HOLIDAY CERTAINLY WAS A CATALYST FOR CHANGE. One in six children aged 5-16 were identified as having a probable mental health problem in July 2021, a huge increase from one in nine in 2017. That's five children in every classroom! The contemporary pressures faced by young people, post-pandemic, are impacting their wellbeing and their futures. The World Health Organisation reported that one-third of mental health problems in adulthood are directly connected to an adverse childhood experience (ACE).

entures and Falcons are supporting an increasing number of young people struggling with mental health conditions and ACEs. We share the hope and love of Jesus, whilst recognising the holistic needs of each child, to enable them to feel safe. We are grateful to host a high calibre of leaders, whose dedication to safeguarding creates a space where young people can share their deepest fears, concerns and hurts; both past and present.

CPAS is committed to ensuring safeguarding at the core of everything we do. We believe every ministry stream requires high quality training and support to uphold excellence in safeguarding practice.

At the start of 2024, we welcomed Elspeth Young as our new Safeguarding Manager to support both Ventures and Falcons, as well as the wider organisation. Elspeth is a registered mental health nurse with 15 years of NHS experience. She has spent the majority of her career working with hard-to-engage young people with highrisk behaviours in a variety of roles. She became a Christian in 2015, and serves alongside her husband in her local church.

Life of Patronage

The Church Times is a weekly newspaper that covers the latest news, comments, features and more on faith, culture and society. Towards the end of the newspaper you will find the jobs section, where dozens of posts are advertised. As the largest patron in the UK, overseeing 700 parishes, which includes over 2,000 churches, CPAS is involved with over 100 appointments

each year. So, when you are looking at the jobs page in the Church Times, there is a strong likelihood that many of those appointments will be managed by Mike Duff, our Patronage Secretary, and Dagmer Dias, Executive Assistant to the Patronage team.

Anyone who has been through the process of finding and appointing a vicar will know that it is anything but straightforward. The process involves three different parties and is broken down into two stages (preparing to appoint and making the appointment). Within the two stages are 13 components, all of which must be followed through promptly, to avoid any unnecessary delays. As patron, CPAS' role is to nominate or present the candidate; the Bishop appoints or licenses him/her; the parish receives him/her as their new incumbent. If



all parties agree, there is a very good chance for a successful appointment. The aim of the CPAS Patronage team is to work closely and collaboratively with both the Parish representatives and the diocese.

Why is this so important?

As patron, CPAS shares the responsibility for the continuity of the spiritual life of the parish. and finding the right leader is utterly crucial to this. We have observed over the years how, when the right person is found, incredible things have occurred. Congregations have been enthused and empowered. New ministries have been launched Individuals have stepped up into leadership roles and communities have been impacted and transformed for the glory of Christ. The opposite is also true!

Taking over from Kathy Burch, our longstanding former PA, Dagmer Dias was recruited for the role after having worked in a church during an appointment process.

'Prior to CPAS, I was a family worker for a church in Coventry for two years. 'When our vicar left, I had the opportunity to

I attended a pre-vacancy meeting and was involved in designing a parish profile. We waited patiently for someone to be appointed.

'When I heard about CPAS and the Patronage team's role in the involvement of vacancy processes, I was immediately drawn to it. I had a passion to see churches find the right person to continue leading them, bringing the community together and sharing the gospel of Jesus. It is a privilege to be part of the Patronage team to help in these appointment processes that make a difference to many in the long term.'



Overall Leaders' Conference

The Overall Leaders Conference, which took place on 24-25 November 2023, is a special time in the CPAS calendar. It allows us to meet with, collectively celebrate and give thanks to God for all he does in each season. It is also a time of learning and refinement where together, we explore how we can make CPAS holidays even better.

We began the evening with a time of testimonies and sung

worship. The next day was packed full of content led by several guest speakers. Musician, Michael Tinker, encouraged us to lean into children's imagination. Chris Green, vicar and author, explored how we intentionally create cultures and environments where leadership is multiplied.

Sarah Thrift, Minister for Children and Accessibility at All Saints Crowborough, offered helpful ideas in the form of small adjustments that work to break down barriers and make our holidays more inclusive and accessible.

Our heart was to understand where our churches stood on this matter, and how CPAS can best engage with parishes and their leaders to support their conversations, represent their views, underpin them with prayer and maintain a focus on mission and evangelism.

Since we last wrote to you, the story of LLF has moved on and the divide between those in favour of the prayers and those against has increased. At CPAS, for the sake of clarity, we have attempted to be transparent with both our churches and you, our supporters, in relation to our position on the matter.
