Our Heritage



The Arrow Leadership Programme is run by CPAS. We are an Anglican evangelical mission agency committed to growing leaders and growing churches within the Church of England. Our founders' vision was the 'gospel to everyone's door with the single aim to glorify God.' It is our conviction that leadership of healthy local churches is essential to the realisation of this vision. Arrow was established in the UK by CPAS in 1999. Arrow UK, now in our 27th year, is part of a growing Alliance of countries who run Arrow.

The Purpose



Arrow exists to develop Christian leaders for the church of the 21st century:

- Leaders dependent on the grace of God, confident about who they are in Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit.
- Leaders clear about their unique call and consistent in living it out.
- Leaders serving the kingdom with personal lives modelled on the servant character of Jesus.
- Leaders passionate for and committed to evangelism.
- Leaders skilled and competent to lead organisations or churches at a time of great challenge and change.

The Programme



Arrow is a programme aimed at life transformation. It is not merely another course or conference. It doesn't simply add a few extra skills to the life of the leader, but considers the deeper issues of call and character. Over 18 months it provides an opportunity to grow through teaching, reflection, worship, interaction, application, accountability and fun. The elements of the programme are:

- Four five-day residentials and three one-day events.
- A monthly meeting with a mentor.
- Two meetings with other participants between each residential.
- Guided reading, reflection and integration work (approximately three hours per week).

Your Support



Arrow is challenging. The person you know would value your prayers and practical support as they go through the programme. We will invite you to attend the Preparation day on Saturday 14 March, where we outline what Arrow is all about and help you to understand your role. We will send you a timetable and prayer pointers before each residential. We will also invite you to Take Two, a day midway through the programme (9 January 2027) and Moving On, the final day of the programme which celebrates all that God has done during Arrow (9 October 2027).
