CHRISTIAN WITNESS

One of CPAS' prayerful aspirations is to see every Christian become a courageous witness. I recently reflected on the great challenge of this when reading Carl Trueman's The Rise and Triumph of the Modern Self, which is fast becoming a best-selling overview of the rise of modernity and its challenges for Christian life and witness.

His thesis is summarised by one reviewer as follows: 'the world once looked to a transcendent source to legitimate values, but now is purely immanent'. If our culture views values as something defined by human society, this has big implications for Christian witness.

Humanity is in need of external and eternal rescue, yet it is becoming ever more difficult to speak of our sinful nature and the lostness that is so key to the biblical narrative.

Paul tells us that, on the cross, Jesus took our place so that the fallout of sin upon us might be removed and that we might know a restored life in his presence (2 Corinthians 5:21). Amazing and grace-filled as this sounds, it is a toxic idea to an 'immanent' culture.

Please join me in praying that, through CPAS' work, leaders might know the Lord's help in articulating Christian truth in our post-truth world.

Pray that Christians will be courageous witnesses for the gospel, and that the Holy Spirit will show men, women and children of their need for God's amazing forgiveness and gracious atonement.

Prayer points:

- Ask for wisdom for the interview panel at St Margaret's Stanford-le-Hope with Mucking as they seek to appoint a leader committed to Bible-based, evangelical preaching and teaching.
- Pray for St Mary's Eastrop to appoint a new leader to take them forward in being a sevendays-a-week church for all ages through teaching, fellowship, worship and mission.
- Pray for churches running appointment processes for the second or third time having not found the right applicant. Ask God to lead the right person to them, and strengthen those leading in the interim.

VENTURES AND FALCONS

e hope to run a flexible programme of COVID-secure residentials, day events and online events. Pray that the Bible teaching, games and activities will help 8-18s explore life with Jesus, whatever the format.





Prayer points:

- Pray for wisdom for leaders as to the best way to deliver the Christian teaching. Pray this is really engaging and leads thousands of young people closer to Christ.
- Ask God's blessing on children in the Falcons community, many of whom face disadvantages. Pray that the effects of the pandemic will not hinder them, and that they will know God's amazing love and care.
- Praise God that new young people are getting involved with Ventures and Falcons, despite all the uncertainty of the last year. Pray for continued growth for this ministry.

CALLING YOUNG DISCIPLES

PAS' six-year project with Worcester diocese is now in its fourth year. Church leadership teams and mission enablers will gather on Thursday and Friday to look at their mission and vision for reaching young people.

FALCON POWER

Falcon holidays are fun, friendship, and faith-based activity breaks for youngsters who endure challenging circumstances, and they can transform lives: as 10-year-old Alex said, 'On the Falcon holiday, I learnt that everyone is different, everyone is special, and God will always be with me'.

So we were determined to find ways to respond to COVID-19 in an agile way, given any potential restrictions and last-minute changes that will affect summer plans. On 6 February, we held a Zoom conference for holiday leaders and other volunteers to share ideas on how we might bless these wonderful young people this summer, given the uncertainty we face.

We sent all those attending a cream tea in the post, along with a leadership booklet and a candle to help us learn, plan, pray and worship together whilst having fun.

We started the day with Dr Eli Gardner, clinical psychologist and director of Kids Matter (which helps churches serve the most vulnerable families) putting us in the shoes of young people who've endured lockdown. We spent time together in prayer and worship, then Claire Corley (volunteer leader and CPAS Arrow graduate) helped us consider how to keep teams motivated, despite disruptive restrictions.

The conference's online break-out rooms were great spaces to talk through problems and solutions. For example, one leader suggested filming and editing videos with the children if lockdown made it impossible to meet physically. They would be able to collaborate on a creative, fun activity, even if they couldn't all be in the same room, and the idea was enthusiastically received.

One leader summed up the experience with, 'I feel very encouraged to get back on the horse!'. With that 'can do' attitude, and God's help, we are optimistic about delivering a COVID-secure programme of events this summer that will see disadvantaged children having fun, making new friends and exploring life with Jesus.
